3 **QUESTION OF:** **Non-proliferation of Nuclear Weapons**

11 *Welcoming* the efforts, progress and agreements on nuclear non-proliferation achieved in  
12 recent years,

13  
14 *Reaffirming* the principles of the Non-proliferation Treaty and the Comprehensive Test Ban  
15 Treaty,

16  
17 *Further reaffirming* the threat of nuclear weapons to the international peace and security,

18  
19 *Emphasizing* that any offensive use or threat of offensive use of nuclear weapons constitutes a  
20 violation of the UN Charter,

21  
22 *Observing* the increasing level of commitment of the international community in enforcing  
23 the Non-proliferation regime, with note to the Resolution 1441,

24  
25 *Expressing* concern with the instability in the Middle-Eastern and Asian region caused by  
26 nuclear proliferating states,

27  
28 *Further expressing* the concern that nuclear weapons might fall into the hands of terrorist  
29 organizations,

30  
31 *Fully aware* of possible clandestine nuclear weapon production by other member States,

32  
33 *Praising* the International Atomic Energy Agency for their work on the safeguarding of the  
34 peaceful use of nuclear energy,

35  
36 1. *Recalls* all Member States to sign and ratify the Non-proliferation Treaty, the  
37 Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty, the Biological and Toxic Weapons Convention and the  
38 Chemical Weapons Convention, and to fully respect them;

39  
40 2. *Urges* all Member States possessing nuclear weapons to accomplish the total  
41 elimination of their nuclear arsenals as set out in Article 6 of the NPT, and to take the  
42 necessary steps to enable substantial progress towards its implementation before the  
43 review conference scheduled for 2005;

45 3. *Calls upon* all Member States to engage in diplomatic efforts, to persuade all non-  
46 member states of the treaties by diplomatic means, to acknowledge the treaties, and to sign  
47 and ratify them if this has not yet been accomplished;

- 49 4. *Suggests* that the General Assembly establish a commission to discuss the possibility  
50 of increasing the powers of the International Atomic Energy Agency, with regard to the  
51 monitoring of all military and non-military nuclear activity worldwide;  
52
- 53 5. *Encourages* the drafting of an official International Atomic Energy Agency list of  
54 States suspected of not abiding by the Non-proliferation Treaty and the Comprehensive Test  
55 Ban Treaty obligations, and that this list be submitted to the Secretary General on an annual  
56 basis for formal review;  
57
- 58 6. *Further suggests* that the International Atomic Energy Agency makes  
59 recommendations to the Secretary General on measures to deal with countries violating the  
60 Non-proliferation Treaty and the Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty, who can bring those  
61 recommendations under the attention of the Security Council by means of the use of Article  
62 99 of the Charter;

- 64 7. *Recommends* to the Security Council and to the Secretary General to take a more  
65 active role in imposing sanctions upon Member States that disregard their commitment to the  
66 Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty and the Non Proliferation Treaty, as such disregard  
67 constitutes a threat to international peace and security according to Article 39 of the Charter  
68 upon the recommendation of the International Atomic Energy Agency;  
69
- 70 8. *Further recommends* that the countries of Israel, the current Arabic League, Iran and  
71 Turkey become nuclear weapons-free under the supervision of the IAEA, that these countries  
72 become chemical weapons-free under the supervision of the Organisation for the Prohibition  
73 of Chemical Weapons, and that these countries become biological and toxic weapons-free  
74 countries, under the supervision of the committee that is being established by the Ad-hoc  
75 Group of the States that was formed in September 1994, in accordance with the Third  
76 Biological Weapons Convention;  
77
- 78 9. *Urges* all states to submit a report disclosing their concerns on possible clandestine  
79 nuclear activity, so as to provide a basis for IAEA investigation in order to draft the proposed  
80 list;  
81
- 82 10. *Stresses* that uniform standards must apply to all States in enforcing the Non-  
83 proliferation Regime;  
84
- 85 11. *Expressing* the hope that all countries will cooperate with the UN, the IAEA and all  
86 other relevant organizations in the matters concerning the non-proliferation of nuclear  
87 weapons.
